The Korean Cultural Center, Los Angeles (KCCLA) will present a traditional Korean Cultural Heritage Workshop, **'Iksan Han Ryang Chum'** on Monday, August 13, 2018 at 1:00p.m. on the 3rd floor of the Korean Cultural Center Los Angeles, Ari Hall.

As the eighth workshop of the year, Kim, Ji-lip (Korean National Intangible Cultural Property No.27, Seung-mu, Candidate) will teach 'Iksan Han Ryang Chum', which refers to Scholar's Dance. It was very popular dance as it was one of the few repertoires mainly performed by men.

Han Ryang Chum

Han Ryang Chum originally had dramatic elements with satirical tones, but later evolved to a solo male dance that represents the noble intellectuals, Seonbi (virtuous scholars).

Through this program, the participants will be given a chance to learn "Pung Ryu Yeo Jeong" which roughly translates to a journey of wind and water, the dance portrays the beauty of living a life that goes beyond material wealth and fame. Ethereal moves of a free spirit take you to a place free from all worldly concerns and Kim Ji-lip style stands out in a way that it makes the audience feel as if it's them dancing through his body, creating a true sense of oneness with the audience.

This program will present a valuable opportunity both for the general public and emerging artists based in the U.S. to learn Korean traditional dance directly from a master, deepening their understanding upon Korean dance.

The workshop program is free, but on-line or phone reservation has to be made prior to the event.
