The Korean Cultural Center Los Angeles pleased to present the online project < **Korean Art @ Home "MINHWA" Episode 1 & 2** > which will be posting on both Monday, June 22nd and Friday, June 26th, 2020 at YouTube KCCLA.

During the unexpected nature of COVID-19 in the U.S., all the 2020 Korean Culture Day events will be held virtually to ensure everyone's health and safety. This online project was organized in the new platform of Korean art that has recently been widely applied among artists by online in their respective spaces, editing and producing videos.

*About Korean Minhwa

By definition, Minhwa is "painting of the people" or "popular painting". This type of painting was often the work of anonymous craftsmen who faithfully adhered to the styles, canons, and genres inherited from the past. Minhwa also involved a magical dimension. They were believed to possess beneficial virtues and to protect the owner and his family from evil forces. They feature popular themes such as cranes, rocks, water, clouds, the sun, moon, pine-trees, tortoises, insects, and flowers.

Minhwa is a traditional type of art that was popular in the 18th century to the beginning of the 20th century in Joseon. Until now, Minhwa was known to merely mimic the styles of the past, without reflections of the artist's originality. Nowadays, modern Minhwa art embraces the artists' own colors and contemporary trends while maintaining traditional ways.
