



Korean Cultural Center, Los Angeles visits Arizona State University (ASU) to Promote Korean History and Culture

The Korean Cultural Center in Los Angeles (Director Jung Sangwon) announced that they will be hosting the "K-Culture, 2023 Korean History and Culture Experience" event in collaboration with the School of International Letters and Culture and the Asia Center at Arizona State University (ASU), inviting ASU students and local residents.

On September 16th at the ASU Pima Auditorium, this day-long event will promote a proper understanding of Korean history and culture through lectures by the respective hosting organizations on modern Korean history, the Hallyu Wave, and Korean cinema in the morning. In the afternoon, attendees will have the opportunity to experience diverse Korean cultural activities such as trying Korean food (Bibimbap), K-POP, Taekwondo, traditional Korean ceremonies and rituals, as well as trying on Hanbok, the traditional Korean clothing.

Notably, ASU's K-Pop dance club, KoDE (K-Pop Dance Evolution), will showcase the latest K-Pop dances from Korea and engage participants in experiencing the Hallyu (Korean Wave) phenomenon.

During the traditional ceremony and tea event, Ms. Youngmi Lee, the director of the Myeongwon Cultural Heritage Foundation, will introduce traditional rituals using persimmon leaf tea, lotus leaf, and hydrangea tea and allow participants to make snacks using dried figs and pecans. This event provides a great opportunity to promote Korean tea culture and etiquette to local participants who may have had little exposure to traditional Korean culture.

During the Hanbok experience session, participants will have the chance to try on various traditional Korean garments, including royal attire (Gonryongpo), queen's attire (Hongwonsam), groom's attire (Gwanbok), bride's attire (Wonsam), and everyday attire worn by commoners. Additionally, props commonly seen in Korean dramas, such as hair ornaments, wedding crowns, hats, hairpins (Yongcham), and jade hairpins (Okdae), will also be introduced.

Director Sangwon Jung stated, "This year's ongoing K-Culture Experience outreach events play a crucial role in helping people overseas gain a correct understanding of Korean history and culture and allowing them to experience our culture's unique charm and beauty directly. Through continuous communication and cultural exchange events with local residents, we hope to deepen the friendship and trust between our two countries."
