## KCCLA Offers In-person & Online Korean Classes



The Korean Cultural Center, Los Angeles (KCCLA) and King Sejong Institute Center, U.S.A (KSICUSA) will launch a new 12-week semester of online and in-person Korean Classes beginning on January 4th, 2022.

A total of nine classes in seven levels will be offered for each of the online and in-person classes\* (Introductory Korean, Basic A, B, Intermediate A, B, C, and Advanced A). Registration is only online at <https://www.kccla.org/koreanlanguageprogram/>

beginning on December 21st on a first-come, first-served basis. **(\*The number of in-person classes offered is subject to change.)\***

Each in-person class (Tuesday evenings from 7 - 9 pm PT from January 4th to March 22nd, 2022) is limited to a maximum of 10 students for social distancing and a low student-to-instructor ratio. Each student must be able to present a COVID-19 Vaccination Record.

Online classes (Thursday evenings from 7 - 9 pm PT from January 6th to March 24th, 2022) will be strictly capped at 30 students to ensure the best possible remote learning experience.

We are also pleased to announce that a free online Korean Placement Test is available at <https://nuri.iksi.or.kr/front/page/participation/onlineLevelTest/main.do> You will be able to get an immediate evaluation of your appropriate level. You may only register for ONE class level and transfers between levels will not be permitted.

The program is open to anyone 18 or older who is interested in learning about Korean language and culture. In-person classes require you to come to KCCLA, and online classes are open only to people who reside in the 50 United States.
